<p>1.Continue to be part of the Whitby Area Sports Aprox £1,500</p> <p>Fund transport to events including making joint teams where possible with St Hedda’s school so that children can enter as many sporting events as possible</p> <p>Aprox £3,000</p>	<p>Children will have access to a wider range of sports and be able to use more equipment than the school currently has.</p>	<p>Children have been able to attend significantly few event due to the covid situation but have had high quality PE lessons and activities at school. Our playground is boisterous and full of active children</p>

Continue to buy in experienced coaches to supplement staff expertise Staff to run an after school club – sports, gardening, cookery etc Aprox £ 500	Children will have the opportunity to take part in tennis coaching over the Summer and Autumn terms (equipment will be also kept in the outside area so pupils can choose to play tennis at playtimes)	Tennis coach September – December provided half a term with each class pre lockdown. Supply cover needed</p> <p>£800 left to spend</p>

Buy any equipment necessary to supplement our existing equipment and other unforeseen expenditure</p> <p>Rrepairs to outside play equipment</p> <p>Aprox £ 4,000</p>	<p>A greater range and variety of equipment to support the teaching of PE (eg soft rugby balls) and to encourage the children to be more active at playtime (eg moveable football goals)</p> <p>Estimates to be sought to repair and revamp the outside play equipment so that the EYFS children can continue to enjoy the area.</p>	<p>Some spending in this area but most still to spend. Children were provided with PE bags to keep their kit in, this will continue in future years. Kit is no longer lost as all kept in the bags. The outside equipment store will be repaired or replaced with money from this category.</p> <p>Due to the on-going situation our handyman is unable/unwilling to come into school – we have now found someone and they are coming in to give quotes from the fire pit to the trim trail</p>
